

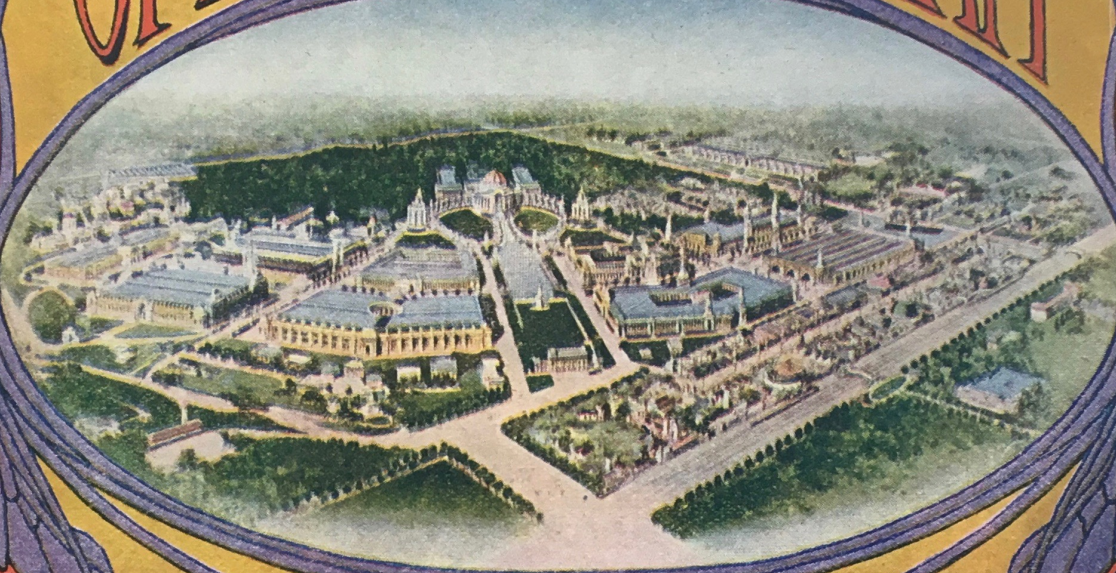

- 1903—Feb. 10. President Francis departed for Europe on his record-breaking trip of exploitation.
- 1903—Feb. 23. President Francis presents the cause of the Exposition in person to King Edward of England.
- 1903—March 2. President Francis is received in Paris with distinguished attentions by President Loubet.
- 1903—March 4. President Francis is received in Madrid.
- 1903—March 9. President Francis was received in private audience by Emperor William.
- 1903—March 10. President Francis was admitted to private audience with King Leopold of Belgium.
- 1903—March 19. President Francis returns to New York.
- 1903—April 30. Dedicatory Exercises at St. Louis. President Francis entertains President Roosevelt and ex-President Cleveland.
- 1904—April 30. Louisiana Purchase Exposition opens with ceremony.
- 1904—Nov. 26. President Francis welcomes President Roosevelt to the World's Fair.
