A special meeting of the Vestry held at 2 P.M. this day at office of Secretary, at Mortgage Trust Co

Meeting opened with prayer & directing collect by the Rector

Minutes of meeting June 3<sup>rd</sup> read & approved.

Treas. report for Sept. read by Act. Treas. Sheldon, Balance

Sept 1<sup>st</sup> - \$1288<sup>05</sup> Cur. receipts \$927<sup>39</sup> Disb \$1106<sup>43</sup> bal. 10/1/19 \$1198<sup>51</sup>

Matter of interest on monthly balances at bank, brought up by Tras. and on

motion recorded & carried, it was left to Tras. to investigate, with power to act.

The Rector presented a statement from Mr. Chas. Galloway, Organist & Choirmaster

requesting an addition (~~\$1000.00~~) to his compensation, for expense

of himself & Choir; after a full discussion it was "moved & carried

that same be granted, <sup>in amount of \$1000.00</sup> and that the Systems Committee

the Rector & Treasurer devise ways & means to secure the amount.

Repairs & Supplies Com. <sup>by Mr. Sheldon</sup> reported two bad leaks in roof of Church, & that he

had ordered repairs made - this action was approved, & it was moved &

carried that other roofing repairs be ordered <sup>done</sup> at best possible figure.

Moved & carried that the Secy prepare a suitable minute for record,

on the death of our late member F. N. Judson & a copy be sent <sup>to Mrs. J. G. Calhoun</sup> his daughter.

Mr. Ford nominated Mr. H. J. Pettengill to fill vacancy caused by Mr.

Judson's death - Mr. Williams seconded, and he was unanimously elected.

Moved, seconded & carried - that the action of the Wardens & Rector in

approving the acceptance by Mr. J. R. Barroll of the appointment

of Chairman of the Finance Com. for St. Peter's Parish, in the

interests of Christ Church Cathedral Centennial Program

be approved.

The Rector announced Committees of the Vestry, (see list inserted here)

and there being no further business to come before it, the Vestry adjourns
