The Rector is temporarily without an Assistant, but the Rev. Joseph H. Harvey, of the City Missions Staff, is helping out by taking services on Sunday nights at Epiphany Chapel. One of the most necessary improvements at the Chapel is a hardwood floor, for when the Chapel was built three years ago it was felt that a temporary floor would do for awhile. Now, however, it is absolutely necessary for the preservation of the building and for the comfort of those who attend the Chapel to have a permanent floor. One member of St. Peter's Church has already sent a check for \$100.00 for this purpose. The men of Epiphany Chapel are willing and thoroughly competent to do the work of laying the floor, the material being the only thing that is needed. The annual meeting of St. Peter's Guild was held in the Parish House Tuesday, January 3d. Splendid reports were read for the year just closed and all of the officers were re-elected.
