It is a great pleasure to have with us this morning, the Rev. Canon Talbot, of the National Cathedral, Washington, D. C. The Rector, Vestry and entire congregation of St. Peter's Church are deeply interested in the Cathedral plan. Tomorrow, Monday evening, at 8 o'clock, Canon Talbot will give an illustrated lecture at the residence of Mrs. Hudson E. Bridge, 23 Westmoreland Place.

The United Vestries of St. Louis will meet at Christ Church Cathedral next Monday night. This meeting was scheduled for Friday, the 21st, but was postponed in order that Vestrymen from out of the city, coming to attend the Convention, might be present. Dinner will be served promptly at 6:30 o'clock, and a full attendance is expected, as business of great importance is to be discussed.

Last Monday afternoon, St. Peter's Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary gave the United Offering Pageant, "The Awaiting World," to a large congregation. The pageant was beautiful in every detail and will be repeated on Tuesday evening at 8 o'clock, in the Church, for the benefit of the whole Diocesan Convention and to all others who care to come.

The Eighty-second Convention of the Diocese of Missouri will be held at Christ Church Cathedral next Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Tuesday, being the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, it is hoped that all who would like to come to Communion on that day will attend the Cathedral service at 10 o'clock. The Bishop will give his annual address at this service and the Convention will be organized for business immediately after in Schuyler Memorial House.

All persons desiring to be confirmed this year are asked to send their names to the Rector's Office. The Confirmation Classes for adults will begin on Friday evening, February 11th, continuing each Friday through Lent.

Next Wednesday, January 26th, is the eighty-fourth birthday of our beloved Bishop Tuttle. On the evening of that day the regular reception of the Bishops to the Convention delegates and their friends will be held at the Bishop's residence, 74 Vandeventer Place. We feel sure that the Bishop will be glad to meet members of this congregation at that time.

The annual meeting of the Missouri Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary will be held at Christ Church Cathedral Friday, January 28th, beginning with a celebration of the Holy Communion at 10 o'clock. As this is the occasion of the election of Diocesan officers for the ensuing year, the Rector hopes that a large representation from St. Peter's Branch will be present.

The services next Sunday morning will be as usual. The early celebration will be taken by the Rev. E. S. White, Rector of the Church of the Holy Communion. The Rector's Bible Class, in his absence, will be conducted by Mr. P. S. Russel, and the special preacher next Sunday morning will be the Rev. Chas. S. Carpenter, who has recently come to St. Louis as head of the City Missions. Mr. Carpenter is a man of charming personality, a fine preacher, and one who will endear himself to every congregation in St. Louis as soon as he is known. At the afternoon service next Sunday, the Rev. J. Courtney Jones will be the special preacher.

The Rector earnestly hopes that during his absence from the city the next two weeks, that all the members of this congregation will make a special effort to be present in their places on Sunday, for there is nothing more comforting to the one in charge of a Parish than to feel that his people are loyal, not only to him, but to the services of the Church, of which he is but an humble Minister.
