The past week has been a most important one in our Diocesan Church Year, being the week of the Annual Diocesan Convention, when matters of great importance to the Church are considered and acted upon. One of the important forward steps was the announcement of Bishop Tuttle in his opening address at the Cathedral of the formation of a Diocesan Unit of the Church Service League. He appointed Mrs. Geo. H. Capen Diocesan Chairman.

The Church Service League is a national organization of the Church created at the last general convention at Detroit, to federate and cooperate all of the women's organizations in order to interest all of the women of the Church in the work of the whole Church. Wherever the League has been adopted the parishes and dioceses have felt a stimulus and growth far beyond their expectations, not only in personal service, but in the spiritual life of the Church as well, and have caught the vision and meaning of a National Church.

The services next Sunday will be as usual. The early celebration will be taken by the Rev. J. H. Harvey. The special preacher at the 11 o'clock service will be the Rev. Henry C. Mizner of St. Stephen's Parish, and the Rev. K. A. Stimpson will take the afternoon service.
