The Rector wishes to call special attention to the Children's service on Tuesday afternoon at 4:30. There will be the regular celebration of the Holy Communion on Thursday morning at 10 o'clock. The attendance last Thursday was most gratifying, and the idea of making each Thursday in Lent an occasion of a corporate Communion for the members of St. Mary's Guild, seemed to appeal very strongly. It is hoped that the entire Guild will be present next Thursday, as well as all others of the Congregation, who may be able to come, as this will be the Feast of St. Matthias.

The Lenten Noon-Day Services, held under the auspices of the Brotherhood of Saint Andrew, should prove especially attractive to the business men and women of our churches. The list of speakers is excellent. The addresses of Bishop Longley last week were admirable to a degree, and the congregations were very large. During the coming week the Rev. Mr. Blaisdell, of Calvary Church, Memphis, will be the speaker. It will be remembered that Mr. Blaisdell was formerly Rector of St. Philip's Church, and is one of the ablest of the younger men of the entire Church.
