

Announcements

At the 4:30 service this afternoon the Rector will deliver the fourth lecture on comparative religions. The subject will be: "Zoroastrianism in Relation to Christianity." The large attendance at these services is most gratifying.

There will be an all-day meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary, tomorrow, in the Parish House, beginning at 10 o'clock. A box luncheon will be served at noon, and at 2:30 p. m. the Rector will deliver a lecture on the Prayer Book, to which all the women of the Congregation are most cordially invited.
