Thursday in Holy Week is called Maundy Thursday because of the new commandment the Lord gave to His disciples, that they should love one another, and commemorates the institution of the Lord's Supper, in view of which will be the regular celebration of the Holy Communion at 10 o'clock. On Saturday, Easter Even, the regular service for the administration of Holy Baptism will be held at 4:30.
