Next Thursday is Thanksgiving Day. There will be a celebration of the Holy Communion at 8 and Morning Prayer and sermon by the Rector at 10:30. Surely at this time the citizens of this country have much to be thankful for, so let us come and offer our united prayers and praise to Almighty God, that He may guide not only ourselves, but the leaders of our country in the paths of wisdom and righteousness and to the pursuit of peace with all the nations of the world.

Mr. Galloway, who for several seasons past has given monthly organ recitals at the Graham Memorial Chapel of Washington University, will give his November recital at St. Peter's Church, the organ in Graham Memorial Chapel having been damaged by fire some two weeks ago. At this recital, which will be played this afternoon at three o'clock, at least two of the numbers on the program—an attractive one—will receive their first local rendition. The members of this congregation and the public are most cordially invited.

There will be an all-day sewing meeting of St. Peter's Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary tomorrow, Monday, November 21st, beginning at 10 o'clock. Box luncheon will be served at noon and it is most earnestly hoped every woman who can do so will be present, as there is a great amount of work to be done for the Missionary box.

There will be an inspirational mass meeting at Christ Church Cathedral on Tuesday evening at 8 o'clock on behalf of the Nation-Wide Campaign. The full vested choir of the Cathedral will sing, and it is hoped that at least 100 members of St. Peter's congregation will be present. The meeting will be addressed by the Rev. Mr. Kemerer, one of the Field Secretaries of the Nation-Wide Campaign, and the Rector, who heard Mr. Kemerer last Monday at the Clericus, is especially anxious to have a great response from St. Peter's at this service, as Mr. Kemerer can present this subject as few men in the Church are able to do.

The annual Bazaar and Sale of St. Mary's Guild will be held in the Parish House on Thursday, December 8th, beginning at 10 a. m. There is perhaps no organization in the city of St. Louis as well known as St. Mary's Guild, and the beautiful and useful articles that will be on sale, together with the delightful luncheon and tea that will be served, will make this Bazaar one of the most attractive given in St. Louis, further notice of which will appear in the Bulletin the next two Sundays.

The Diocesan Board of Religious Education has arranged for four meetings at the Church of the Redeemer, Euclid and Washington Avenues, for special adult instruction on November 21 and 28, and December 5 and 12 at 8 p. m. Not only are the Sunday School teachers invited, but parents as well, and it is hoped that a large number from this Parish may respond to this notice.
