THE MASQUE OF PANDORA

The Masque of Pandora is based on the Greek legend of how sin and sorrow came into the world. After Prometheus and Epimetheus had performed their assigned task of creating man and endowing him with all necessary faculties, they incurred the displeasure of Zeus, the Omnipotent. To revenge himself, Zeus determined to offer them a tempting gift. He endowed with life a statue which Hephaestus had wrought, making it the first woman. All the gods contributed something to perfect her, therefore she was called Pandora, "the gift of all the gods." Thus equipped she was conveyed to the house of Epimetheus, whither Prometheus, the farsighted, feeling premonitions of impending evil, had already come to warn his warm-hearted and impulsive brother against any wiles of the immortal gods. Hermes, the divine messenger, first offered Pandora to Prometheus, who coldly rejected her. Then she was led to Epimetheus, who, in spite of his brother's admonitions, received her gladly. In Epimetheus' house was a chest which the oracle of the gods had commanded should remain forever closed.

One day Pandora's curiosity regarding its contents overcame her, and she lifted the lid. Forthwith there escaped a multitude of ills for hapless man—diseases for his body and evil passions for his mind—which scattered themselves far and wide. Of all the fateful contents of the chest, Hope alone remained to bless mankind.

The action of the Masque takes place in a golden glade of ancient Greece.
