CHURCH CONGRESS AT ST. LOUIS

Topics of widespread interest relating both to the Church and the State
are scheduled for discussion at the Church Congress, which is to meet at
St. Louis, May 5, 6, 7 and 8, 1925.

The morning sessions on Thursday and Friday will take the form of
Round Table discussions on the general subject, The Holy Communion. The
topics to be considered under this general heading are: "Proposed Changes
in the Office"; "Extra Rubrical and Non-Rubrical Practices"; "Reservation";
and "The Use of the Chalice." The speakers will include Bishop Charles
Lewis Slattery, D. D., of Massachusetts; Rev. Howard B. St. George, D. D.,
of Wisconsin; Rev. J. H. Randolph Ray, D. D. (Rector of "The Little
Church Around the Corner"); Rev. Floyd W. Tomkins, D. D., of Phila-
delphia; Rev. William B. Stoskopf of Chicago; Bishop Theodore P. Thurs-
ton, D. D., of Oklahoma; Rev. Neil Stanley of Denver, Colo.; Rev. Donald
B. Aldrich of St. Paul's Cathedral, Boston.

There will be four popular meetings on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thurs-
day evenings and Friday afternoon. At the first the subject will be, "Heresy:
What Is It and What Shall We Do With It?" The laymen's point of view
