In the sermon last Sunday it was perfectly evident the Rector was preparing the minds of his Congregation for the observance of Lent. The Lenten Season is a period of self-examination and spiritual discipline for individual and corporate life. It is interesting to know how other Churches are observing this period of the Church's Year. The National Commission on Evangelism of the Congregational Church has put forth a series of questions which are printed below for each local Church to apply itself in a searching self-examination during the coming days of Lent. While we are seeking to develop personal religion this Lent, it would also be well for us to try to develop a corporate sense of religion as a Parish. The Rector suggests that you put these questions in your mirror and look at them frequently between now and Easter:
