Organ :

Rhapsodie Catalane.....*Joseph Bonnet*
(Dedicated to Mr. Galloway)

This is a fantasie on two Catalonian airs the first of which after being announced fortissimo, followed by what might be termed an episode, is treated fugally. The second air, given rather prominently by means of a solo stop, is repeated an octave higher, but in the form of an arpeggio variation, flute stops being employed. Here follows a Cadenza for the pedal, leading into, shall we say, recapitulatory section. Monsieur Bonnet, who is organist at St. Eustace, Paris, is one of the best known of the younger composers of France.

Caprice—"The Brook".....*Gaston Dethier*

This descriptive piece is a merry movement and the picture is obvious. The brook now dashes swiftly, again glides smoothly, now gurgles softly, but is always busy, playful, and full of life. A composition of this style requires a perfect action in the organ; a generation ago such movement would have been impossible of performance on the organ. Mr. Dethier is one of our most distinguished American organists and composers, and is connected with the Institute of Musical Art in New York City. (C. H.)
