# THE SUNDAY SCHOOL

The Sunday School has a new Pre School Department under the expert direction of Miss Catherine Carr. Miss Carr is a graduate of the Wilson School of Kindergarten, and is also one of its present teachers.

Parents are urged to bring their children to Sunday School and put them in charge of Miss Carr in the Parish House while they attend the church services.

Another new department, The Primary School, has been created and is under the direction of Mrs. William Ferrel. Mrs. Ferrel is a graduate of Harris Teachers College and Washington University. Miss Lois Buffalo, graduate of Duke University, and Miss Dorothy Galloway of Washington University are assisting Mrs. Ferrel with this Department.

Through October 9, seventy-six children have been enrolled in the Sunday School. Although this is quite an increase over the number enrolled at the same time last year, we are still looking for a much larger enrollment.

## HONOR ROLL

Second: Class work rated as at least good.

Third: Pledges kept up-to-date.

Fourth: Attendance rated as excellent, that is, one absence and one tardiness, or two absences or two tardinesses will be excused. In case of serious illness, the Rector and the Superintendent of the School will take that under consideration.

Any pupil, who has made the Honor Roll for two semesters of any five consecutive years or for three consecutive semesters of three consecutive years, is eligible for membership in the Honor Society.
