
CHARLES GALLOWAY MENTIONED FOR WORLD'S FAIR ORGANIST.

quarters that Charles Galloway, the wellknown St. Louis musician, had been decided upon as the Exposition's official organist. The appointment has not been made, but it is understood that it will be recommended by the Bureau of Music.

The organist at the World's Fair will be one of the most important positions in the music department. In Festival Hall will be installed the largest and one of the finest organs in the world. It is upon this instrument that the Exposition organist will perform.

It was reported at World's Fair head- , Hall organ. It is supplied with an unusual number of stops and pedals, besides having five keyboards. Recitals on this organ will form an important part of the music programme for Festival Hall.

Mr. Galloway is considered one of the leading organists of this country. He was a pupil of Alexander Guilmont of Paris, France, having taken an extended course under that celebrated master in the French capital. While abroad Mr. Galloway was accepted in several exclusive societies of musicians. societies of musicians.

At this time Mr. Galloway is director of the Apollo Club of St. Louis, and is organist of St. Peter's Episcopal Church. His work has gained for him a national reputation, and he is conceded by musicians to be in the front rank of his pro-
