
CHRISTIAN ENDEAVOR DAY.

Many Attend Exercises at World's Fair After Convention Closes.

Good citizenship exercises, in connection with the observation of Christian Endeavor Day, at the World's Fair, were held in Festival Hall at 4:30 o'clock yesterday.

One thousand Christian Endeavorers attended the meeting. Delegates to the State Convention, which closed with a meeting at the Second Baptist Church, last night, stayed over for to-day's celebration. A feature of the meeting was the singing of the Century Chorus Choir of St. Louis, under the leadership of R. O. Bolt. Charles Galloway played accompaniments on the big concert organ.

The chairman of the meeting was Guy M. Withers, president of the Missouri Christian Endeavor Union and the Missouri Endeavor Publishing Company.

Addresses were made by the Reverend Doctor Wilbur Chapman of New York City, chairman of the Evangelistic Committee of the Presbyterian Church, and Doctor Ira Landrith of the Religious Educational Bureau of Chicago. Doctor Landrith is a well-known reformer and spoke on the subject, "A Christian, Though a Citizen."

At 8 o'clock a concert was given in Festival Hall by the full Century Chorus Choir of 1,200 voices, under the leadership of W. D. Pitzman and R. O. Holt. The Reverend A. Kefford, president Iowa Christian Endeavor Union of Ida Grove, Ia., delivered an address.
