

The Apollo Club of St. Louis, one of the leading male choruses of the West, will give the first of its winter series at the Odeon on Tuesday, Nov. 23.

Assisting the club on this occasion will appear Ludwig Becker, violinist, well known in Berlin musical circles and on the Continent and now concertmaster of the Thomas Orchestra of Chicago, who will play "Fantasia Appassionata," by Viextemps; "Romanza," by Bruch; "Mazurka," by Wieniawski.

The other artist will be Mr. Oscar Seagle, baritone, of Paris, France, who is associated with Mr. Jean de Reszke in his vocal conservatory in that city.

The club is unable at present to announce its entire list of soloists for the remaining concerts. However, at the February concert will appear Madame Osborne-Hannah, soprano, of the Metropolitan Opera Company, and at its April concert Miss Tilly Koenen, the famous Dutch contralto of Amsterdam.

Mr. Charles Galloway is the club's musical conductor.
