Dr. Phillips to Talk at Symphony Tea.

Rev. Dr. Z. Barney T. Phillips, rector of St. Peter's Church, an accomplished musician, will be the speaker at the Symphony Talk and Tea at the winter garden, Euclid avenue and Delmar boulevard, Thursday at 3:45 p. m. He will analyze and explain the new Garofalo symphony, and his talk will be illustrated at the piano.

"First-Time" Symphony to Be Heard.

A symphony played from manuscript will be the principal number in the two programmes given by the Symphony Orchestra, Friday afternoon and Saturday evening of next week at the Odeon. This work is a so-called "romantic symphony"

by the Italian composer and famous organist, Carlo Giorgio Garofalo, which never has been played in its entirety. Two movements of the work were performed at a symphony concert in the Augusteo, Rome, November 29, under the direction of its composer, and the Rome newspapers printed an announcement in their reviews of the event to the effect that the next performance of the new symphony would be "in St. Louis, America," under the conductorship of Max Zach. The new composition is being awaited with great interest by orchestra conductors in the United States, and is somewhat in the nature of an epoch-making event in the present musical season.

A novelty found in this work is the introduction of an organ part. Other symphonies, notably the "Manfred" of Tschaikowsky, has an incidental organ part, but in the new symphony the organ is as important a feature as any of the usual orchestral instruments.

Charles Galloway, the foremost organist of St. Louis, as well as one of the leading American organists, will take this part in the St. Louis premiere of the work.

As soloist in the same two programmes
