

For the first time in the twenty-two years it has been organized, the Apollo Club will have orchestral accompaniment with its concerts, this season. Formerly a piano accompaniment only was used.

In the club's 1915-16 schedule are three special concerts, each having a singer of international note as soloist. The first of these is to be given November 23. Evan Williams, tenor, is to be the soloist. In an attempt to make this concert one of the best it has ever given, the club chorus will give several selections that have been chosen for them by Charles Galloway, director. Two of the club chorus' selections that are expected to be especially effective are, an arrangement of "Home, Sweet Home," by Dudley Buck, and "The Credo," by George Chadwick.

Miss Ethel Leginska, pianist, will be the soloist of the concert February 9. The other special concert of the club, to be given April 2, will feature Mrs. Sophia Braslau, contralto of the Metropolitan Opera Company.

The 1915-16 season of the club is expected to be highly successful, according to Director Galloway. Galloway said more than seventy new subscriptions for the season have been received.

The Apollo Club has eighty active members. It was organized November 7, 1893. Galloway has been director fourteen years.

The officers of the club are: Phillip A. Becker, president; J. B. Cozzens, first vice president; C. B. Hardin, second vice president, and C. W. Hughes, secretary and treasurer.
