

Many Left Outside Church.

Hickson yesterday laid hands on many of the patients in pairs, one hand on the head of each, but his manner was calm and unhurried throughout.

Two of the clergy, late in the afternoon, played the organ for a time, relieving Charles Galloway, organist of St. Peter's, who had played continuously since morning, a few familiar religious airs. The ministers who acted as organists were Dr. Phillips of St. Peter's and the Rev. J. Boyd Coxe of Trinity Church.

When the treatment of those in the church had ended, hundreds of persons were still waiting outside the church. The Rev. L. H. White of St. Mary's Church addressed those outside, saying "God is not going to leave St. Louis tonight on a railroad train. It is only Mr. Hickson who is going. It would be wrong to think that only one man is the instrument of God's healing power." He invited those who believed that the healing power might be exercised by Christian ministers to come to him for the laying on of hands. About 100 accepted the invitation, and he blessed and prayed for each person.
