

THREE RECITALS ARRANGED

FOR ORGANISTS' CONVENTION

National Meeting Will Be Opened
Tuesday at Hotel Chase and
End Friday.

Organ recitals at the Graham Memorial Chapel of Washington University, Christ Church Cathedral and the Scottish Rite Cathedral will feature the twelfth annual convention of the National Association of Organists, opening here Tuesday at Hotel Chase. The convention will be ended Friday with election of officers.

Charles Galloway, organist of St. Peter's Protestant Episcopal Church, will be first soloist at the Graham Chapel recital Tuesday afternoon. He will play the Handel Organ Concerto in D Minor, Borowski's Sonata in A Minor, and Liszt's "Prelude and Fugue on the Name 'Bach'." Marshall Maxwell, organist of Cedar Rapids, Ia., and Arnold Dann, of Pasadena, Cal., will also play.

Techniques of organ playing will be discussed at the business session and delegates will inspect every organ in the city. There will also be lectures on organ building in this country and abroad.

Dr. Percy B. Eversden, president of the Missouri State Council of the national association will deliver the opening address Tuesday morning, and Reginald L. McAll, national president, will respond. Delegates are expected from 24 states.
