Sixth Annual Festival Will Begin Tomorrow

Celebrated Organist Will Perform— Grand Chorus Recital Thursday Evening With 500 Voices—Artists' Concert in the Afternoon.

The sixth annual music festival of the Arkansas Music Teachers' Association will commence temorrow morning with a business meeting at 9:30 a. m. at Glenwood Park, where several papers on important musical subjects will be read by Profs. F. D. Baars, Willibald Lehmann and others. This will be an official meeting of the association, and all members are requested to be present. The public is also invited.

The organ concert will take place at the First M. E. Church, South. The programme for this recital has been carefully prepared, and will more than please all lovers of good music. The numbers on the programme for this concert will consist of organ solos by Mr. Charles Galloway, the great organ soloist, who studied under the great French master of the pipe organ, M. Guilmant. Mr. Galloway is an artist of the first rank, having won a well-deserved reputation on both continents, and though a young man, has reached the top of his profession. His execution on the organ is imposing and brilliant, having a commendable mastery over his instrument that is equaled by few, showing an adequate regard for temperament and possessing an artistic understanding of tone contrast.
