ACOUSTIC QUALTIES OF TEMPLE OF MUSIC ABSOLUTELY PERFECT

Director-General Buchanan of the Pan-American Exposition tested the acoustic properties of the Temple of Music yesterday afternoon and has pronounced them to be absolutely perfect. At 1 o'clock he went to the Temple of Music in company with Francis Fancuelli, leader of the 71st Regiment Band, and several of his soloists. Mr. Buchanan and Leader Fanciulli stood at the extreme end of the building opposite the concert stage while Cornetist W. Paris Page went from one end of the stage to the other, playing at first very loud and gradually decreasing the tone almost to a minimum. Every sound, even the very lowest note, could be heard distinctly and clearly in any part of the building. Then Carmine Stanzione, another soloist of the 71st, played the flute as Mr. Chambers had done the cornet. At the conclusion Director General Buchanan said to a representative of THE TIMES, who was present at the test, that he was eminently satisfied and complimented highly August Esenwein, the local architect, who designed the building. Leader Fanciulli said:

"The acoustic properties are perfect. I have never been in a music hall that had better. You can hear every note distinctly. It would be a pleasure for any musician to play in such a building."
